EM Working Group Plan Reviews – Contact EM Planners anytime to provide updates to any of the Program’s supporting operational plans.

The two programmatic plans that have a set schedule requiring full review and written revisions in accordance with FEMA’s CPG-101 plan development process, submission of those documents to FDEM for review, and approval by FEMA, are:

- the *Comprehensive Emergency Management Program (CEMP) Base Plan*, every four years; next due for final submission to the FDEM by **June 2026**
- the *Local Hazard Mitigation Strategy (LMS)*, every five years; next due for final submission to the FDEM by **September 2025**
